She said the superintendent offered her his telephone to make a date with the board member

Neglect of Duty Charged. "He said the member of the board would give a girl a chance if she appealed to him," said Miss Russell, 'and that he thought I would make an impression upon him."

Charges on which is based Superintendent Aiderson's complaint are gross neglect of duty and that obscene and immoral pictures were on the walls and indecent writing on the doors of the school which Miss Russell failed to remove at the superintendent's request.


