Renewed Confidence

Lifts Grain Prices

CHICAGO, March 26.—Increased
confidence regarding war develop-
ments tended today to lift grain
prices. Corn closed steady at the
same as yesterday's finish to 1-5c
higher, with March \$1.27 3-4 and
May \$1.25 7-8. Oats gained 3-4c
to 1c net. Provisions showed an ad-
vance of two cents to 30c.

Activity on the part of exporters
had much to do with the strength
of oats.

Provisions averaged higher with
grain and hogs.
