Si ipment of perishable crops in the middle west is holding back the supply of freight cars for the Northwest, according to a letter received y the public service commission from O. O. Calderhead, representative of the Oregon and Washington state public service commissions at Washington, D. C.

Mr. Calderhead writes that he has placed the Northwest situation before the car service section of the national railroad administration and that orders were directed March :2 to the Southern Pacific, the Union Pacific the Northern Pacific and the Great Northern companies to send additional cars into the Northwest Calderhead says the Northwest will le hit pretty hard at best, but that the administration is not losing sight of the products of this section of the country and that improvement in the car situation should be shown from now on.

"It will take a few months to get facilities arranged in the east so that cars can be handled at the Atlantic ports with reasonable dispatch and thereby release the equipment for further use," writes Mr. Calderhead However, docks and terminal fact, ities are being constructed as rapidly as possible and the situation will e improving from now on."
