AMENDED LAW DISTRIBUTED

Compilation of Inheritance Statute Completed and Mailed Out

Judge Thomas F. Ryan, assistant state treasurer, on Saturday completed the compilation of the state inheritance tax laws as amended up to date and began mailing them to the state. Important changes in the laws is the graduated schedule increasing the rates of taxation, by an amendment enacted by the 1917 legislature. The schedule which has been effective since May 21, 1917, follows:

For lineal heirs—Inheritance from \$5,000 up to \$25,000, 1 per cent; \$25,000 to \$50,000, 1 1/2 per cent; \$50,000 to \$100,000, 2 per cent; \$100,000 to \$200,000, 2 1/2 per cent; \$200,000 to \$400,000, 3 per cent;

For non-relatives—\$500 to \$2500, 3 per cent; \$2500 to \$5000, 4 per cent; \$5000 to \$10,000, 5 per cent; \$10,000 to \$25,000, 6 per cent; \$25,000 to \$50,000, 7 per cent; \$50,000 to \$100,000, 8 per cent; \$100,000 to \$200,000, 9 per cent; in excess of \$200,000, 10 per cent.

Prior to the amendment the inheritance tax for lineal heirs was 1 per cent on inheritances in excess of \$5000 and for collateral heirs, 2 per cent on amounts in excess of \$2000. For non-relatives the schedule was as follows: Up to \$10,000, 3 per cent; \$10,000 to \$20,000, 4 per cent; \$20,000 to \$50,000, 5 per cent; in excess of \$50,000, 6 per cent.
