RECENT ACTION

Turns Decidedly Weak After Moderate Advance Bearish Reports Cause

Chicago, June 5 .- Corn today re versed its action of yesterday and turned decidedly weak after a moderate advance. Bearish crop reports appeared to be chiefly responsible for the setback. Prices closed heavy. to 1%c net lower, with July \$1.32 % @ % and August \$1.33 %. Oats lost 1/4 to 1c. The outcome in provisions varried from 17c decline

to a rise of 35c.

At first commission houses were generally on the buying side of the corn market, owing to the readiness with which prices had rallied from the initial flurry over the U-boat raid. New advances, however, had not proceeded far before selling pressure increased and values gave way. Announcement that cutting of oats had begun in Oklahoma counted as a bearish factor in the oats market.
