WHEAT AND CORN STANDARDS MADE Consolidation Commission Asks Questions About School Superintendent. To fix the standards for wheat and shelled corn in Oregon to conform to the official standards of the United States as established and promulgated by the secretary of agriculture April 13, this year, and effective July 15, the public service commission has issued an order making the necessary changes.

The main change affecting wheat applies to the hard red spring variety, for which three sub-classes are established instead of four. The eliminated sub-class is known as sub-class (d), or red spring humpback. The other three sub-classes and the descriptions in the order are: (a) Dark northern spring—This sub-class shall include wheat of which 75 per centum or more consists of dark, hard and vitreous kernels, but shall not contain more than 10 per centum of the variety humpback. The only change is the substitution of 75 per centum for 85 per centum.

(b) Northern spring—This sub-class shall include wheat of the class hard red spring, of which less than 75 per centum and more than 25 per centum consists of hard, dark and vitreous kernels, but shall not contain more than 10 per centum of wheat of the variety humpback. The change in this is the substitution of 75 per centum for 85 per centum.

(c) Red spring—This sub-class shall include wheat of the class hard, of which consists of kernels of yellow or mottled appearance, of starchy texture, and of not more
