**CORN FUTURES PROVE ACTIVE**  
Nebraska and Iowa Damage Reports Are Persistent in Chicago-Market

CHICAGO, Aug. 20.—The persistence of damage reports from southern Nebraska and Iowa as well as the southwest coupled with marked strength at Kansas City, brought about active trading in corn futures today, prices scoring net advances of 2 1/2 @ 2 3/4c and closing strong. The advance brought out stop loss orders and although there was some heavy profit-taking on the bulge the advance was well maintained. October corn closed 2 1/4 up at \$1.65 1/2.

Oats were bought by shippers today, and by shorts who were impressed by the corn strength. The undertone of the market was strong. Closing prices were two cents over yesterday, October at 74 1/2c.

In provisions the removal of the maximum price restriction from dry salted meats by the food administration brought about higher prices. Closing prices were at a net advance of 56 1/2 in lard, 25 @ 27 1/2 in ribs to 46 @ 60c in pork.

Sales amounted to 150,000 shares. Domestic bonds were irregular and international featureless. Total sales, par value, \$7,150,000. Old registered 45 lost one-quarter cent on sales.
