COTTON PRICE TO BE FIXED IF NECESSARY

Fair Price for Raw Product to Be Named, States President Wilson

TO HAVE COMMISSION Will Buy Cotton for Use of Government and Allies, Is Plan Outlined

WASHINGTON, Sept. 13.---President Wilson announced today that a fair price for raw cotton will be fixed if that should be deemed necessary after the committee to be appointed by the war industries board has completed inquiry into the general cotton situation.

During the investigation a separate commission of three, soon to be named, will buy cotton for the use of the United States government and the allies at prices to be
