BEARS IN CORN GET ADVANTAGE
Favorable War News and Better Weather Have Decidedly Reducing Effect
CHICAGO, Sept. 14.—Favorable war news and better weather gave a decided advantage today to the bears in corn. Largely as a result the market finished nervous, 1 to 3 cents lower with October \$1.52 1/2 to \$1.50 1/2 and November \$1.49 1/2 to \$1.50 1/2. Oats lost 1/2 to 3/4 c. The outcome in provisions varied from 10c decline to 12c advance. Corn developed weakness quickly, and at no time displayed much power to recover.
