Advances in Corn Result from President's Note

CHICAGO, Oct. 15.—Sharp new advances in the corn market today resulted largely from President Wilson's note to Germany. Quotations, although unsettled, were 2c to 4c net higher with November \$1.24 1/2 to \$1.24 3/4 and December \$1.21 1/2 to \$1.21 3/4. Oats gained 3/4c to 5/8c and provisions 15c to 1/4c.

Corn traders appeared to be nearly unanimous in drawing bullish conclusions as to the effect of the president's stand. In addition, the definite understanding that the federal government might quickly come into the market as a liberal buyer tended further to discourage speculative selling.

Oats went up grade with corn. Domestic shipping demand was good. Word of probable big export requirements gave decided strength to provisions and so likewise did upturn in the value of corn and hogs.
