Corn Market Still Shows Rapid Decline at Chicago

CHICAGO, Oct. 30.-Corn rapidly declined in value today under liquidation due for the most part to the new German and Austrian notes received at Washington. Prices closed nervous, 3 1/2 to 5 1/2 net lower with November \$1.17 1/2 @ 1/2 and December \$1.14 1/2 @ 1/2. Oats finished off 25c to \$1.37.
Oats gave with corn. Exporters were still out of the market and domestic demand was slow.
Weakness in the hog market as well as in grain caused provisions to tumble. Pork especially made a sharp descent.

Attorney General Brown has approved as to legality the \$98,000 improvement bonds of the Squaw Creek Irrigation Project of Deschutes and Jefferson counties. Since the amount is less than \$100,000 approval of the federal capital issues committee is not necessary.
