"Reconstruction work will tax the productive capacity of the country for lumber and other materials for years," said Edwin B. Parker, commissioner of priorities for the War Industries Board, in Chicago yesterday, speaking to the National Lumber Association in convention there.

He said he understood construction permits for new work in New York soon would total \$200,000,000.

He said the export trade in the lumber business was to be a big thing in the future, and that a long period of prosperity was ahead for the farmers and the whole country.

This sounds good to Oregon ears, where our great timber resources and our agricultural possibilities are as yet only touched around the edges.

Oregon will be a bright spot on the prosperity map for the future.

Now the "freedom of the seas" is about assured, with the Hun navy out of the hands of the Hun.






