The container should be clean and free from leaks. Packing is done by sprinkling a layer of salt in the bottom of the container, then distributed over it 3 or 4 inches of shredded cabbage. This should be well firmed with a wooden stamper or potato masher. The proportion of salt in the kraut is about 1 pound to every 40 pounds of cabbage. Layer after layer of salt and cabbage are packed, until the container is full or the desired amount secured. A handful of clean cabbage leaves or a cloth is sometimes put on top of the kraut, and a glazed plate or a board fitted into the container as a cover. A weight of granite or flint rock is placed on the cover, and a cloth should be tied over the top of the container to keep out insects.

About two weeks will be required for fermentation in a warm room, or from four to six weeks, in a cool cellar. Bubbles will rise in the brine during fermentation. After fermentation is completed the bubbles will fall to appear when the container is jarred. The kraut is then ready for use.

During fermentation a film or scum is apt to form on the surface of the brine. This should be skimmed off to prevent spoiling. Sauerkraut to be kept for any length of time will be less apt to spoil if the brine is covered with a thin layer of hot paraffine.—J. I. Stahl.

**HOLLAND'S FRUIT.**

The fruit crops in Holland were below the average this year, on the whole. A poor crop of pears and apples is everywhere throughout the country. A recent report from there says: "The general condition of pears is from bad to a failure, while apples are medium to rather bad. Plums are about the same as apples. The crop of cherries has been fair. The late varieties are good in some northern sections, but in the southern parts of the country they range from rather bad to failure."


**LIME SPREADERS.**

**The Rootery**

If cabbage could talk we might hear strange tales from the sauerkraut barrel. Not many generations ago "kraut makin'" was a community event, and a time when the young men of each household carefully washed their feet and changed socks so that they might help tramp down cabbage in the barrel. Today in a few homes is sauerkraut made on such a large scale. A keg or an earthen crock is used as a container and the packing is done by hand rather than by foot.

The cabbage need not all be firm and solid, but loose or split heads may be used. Cabbage too poor for market can thus be utilized. A common method of making is to remove the outside leaves of cabbage, cut or slice the heads into long, fine shreds and pack them with salt in a crock or keg. Ordinarily, metal containers should not be used.
