**Corn Prices Take Sharp**  
**Break Due to Imports**

**CHICAGO, Jan. 22.—Announce-**ment that vessel charters had been taken for one million bushels of Argentine corn to come to the United States brought about a sharp break here today in prices of corn. The market closed unsettled, 1 1/2 to 3 1/2 net lower with February 128 1/2 to 129 1/2 and May 123 to 123 1/2. Oats lost 3 1/2 cents to 3 1/2. Provisions finished unchanged to 55 cents lower.

**INFLUENCES AID RAILWAY ISSUES**

**Traders Lean to Shorts—Efforts to Depress Quotations Fail**

**NEW YORK, Jan. 22.—Traders** committed to the short side of the stock market, the renewed efforts to depress quotations failed today but met with indifferent success, standard securities evincing an unexpected degree of support from substantial sources. Declaration of the two percent dividend on Baltimore and Ohio common and a better understanding of recent ruling of the interstate commerce commission regarding rates were helpful to rails, in which gains of one to two points were quite general.

**STEELS AND EQUIPMENTS ALSO** showed their irregular improvement to more helpful trade tendencies including the statement that the United States steel corporation and other large producers are continuing to operate at a high rate of capacity.
