Revolutionary Changes in Court Procedure Urged
Radical changes in the judicial system of the state are proposed in two bills introduced yesterday by Representative Hare. One would allow the supreme court to make rules governing the circuit courts to take precedence over the statutes. The other is the bill from Judge Carey of Portland which has frequently been discussed in the press at length.

SUFFRAGE GIVEN AID BY OREGON

State Senate Gets Promise of Early Consideration at Washington

Letters were received yesterday from Joseph P. Tumulty, Congressman W. C. Hawley and United States Senator McNary acknowledging receipt and promising early consideration of the senate joint memorial urging equal suffrage for women and an appropriation for development of the Owyhee irrigation project.

Three bills were up for third reading at the forenoon session. Senator Norblad's bill making it possible for administrators in other states of being persons in Oregon to bring suits in the courts of Oregon was passed without dissent.

Senator Eddy's bill, providing that in case of a deadlock on opinions under consideration by the supreme court the decision of the lower court shall be held affirmed was referred because of the absence of Senator Eddy. The measure grows out of repeated deadlocks of the supreme court in the famous Myers will case.

A bill by Senator Norblad providing that streets through cities and towns that are part of the general systems of highways be constructed partially at the expense of the general fund of the state was passed. Senator Norblad explained that the bill is primarily to relieve a condition in Astoria, where an unimproved street is part of the Columbia River highway and where, under the charter, streets can be improved only at the expense of abutting property owners many of whom cannot afford the assessment. The bill, it is said, would relieve other cities and towns. Senator Orton objected that the bill applies only to cities of 25,000 or less population and said Portland has similar difficulties.

Senator Norblad said it would be agreeable to him to have the bill amended to include Portland. Senator Dimick objected that the bill does not state what part of the necessary money should be taken from the general fund, declaring that the council might draw 99 per cent from the general fund.

The house joint memorial urging congress to pass a pending bill for government assistance in developing Crater Lake National Park was adopted.

Representative Dodd's joint memorial relating to the reclamation of arid lands in Umatilla county and urging passage of the Sniott bill was adopted by the senate.

Insurance Agents Arrested by Chief of Police Varney

A. B. Cohen and M. M. Stark of San Francisco were arrested by Chief of Police Varney for soliciting accident and health insurance without an insurance license from the Chinese in Salem, and were taken to the chief's office, where they returned the money collected from the Chinese.

They were ordered to appear before the insurance commissioner at 11 o'clock yesterday, but they failed to make their appearance, and it is understood that insurance Commissioner Wells will file a complaint against the insurance company for permitting these men to solicit business without a license, and will ask the court to assess a fine against the company.

The insurance commissioner warns the public against these men, as they are not authorized to represent any company.

Abolition Measures Are Beginning to Show Faces

A number of repealing measures to abolish present smaller commissions came into the house yesterday to pave the way for the work of the consolidation commission.

Representative Weeks of Marion county introduced two of these, being bills to do away with the Umpqua river pilot commission and the sailors' boarding house commission. The consolidation commission and board to examine voting machines are also hit in the bills.
