Reports of Deportations Are Declared Unjustified

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12.—Anthony Caminetti, commissioner general of immigration said tonight that reports of prospective wholesale deportations of aliens were "unjustified."

"It is estimated that about 6,000 aliens are to be deported, the great majority because they are insane or otherwise public charges," Mr. Caminetti said. "Most of the remainder are diseased or have been

found guilty of offenses subjecting them to deportation. A few, are agitators who are opposed to our form of government or all organized government. None of the aliens recently taken from Seattle to Ellis island for deportation has any connection with the strike at Seattle.

"Deportees now in custody have been rounded over a considerable period of time but could not be deported before because of the shortage of shipping facilities.

"All reports that the troops are being mobilized to deport anarchists or others are exaggerated."

Representatives Want to Have Utilities Returned

Representatives Kuhl and McFarland would like to see the railroads, telephone and telegraph lines and cable companies returned to the same private ownership from which they were taken by the government as a war emergency and in a joint resolution introduced in the legislature declare that there has been mismanagement which has cost and caused the waste of several hundred millions of dollars.

PACKERS WILL BE MENACE TO U. S. IS CLAIM

Francis J. Heney Declares They Control Cheese, Oleo and Butter Market

COMPETITION INJURED

Small Concerns 'Smothered'—Refrigerator Cars Alleged Misused

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12.—Francis J. Heney, counsel for the federal trade commission, testifying tonight before the house interstate commerce commission, declared that within ten years and probably within five, the five leading meat packers would control the entire food supply of the country and would be able to charge whatever prices they desired. Mr. Heney said the packers had extended their activities into so many fields that they had become a menace to the country. They now control the cheese, oleomargarine and butter markets, he said, and rapidly are obtaining a monopoly of a large number of other food products. With their large capital and their special provisions, the witness declared, they are able to "smother the competition."

Mr. Heney said the packers received their first start toward domination. The second step taken by the packers, he said, was the obtaining of special privileges from the railroad for their refrigerator cars, intended for perishable meat products alone. The packers, Mr. Heney said, now use refrigerator cars for perishable and imperishable goods alike and at such a great saving in money and in time deliveries as to destroy competition. As a result, he said, wholesale grocers are being driven out of business.

Government ownership of refrigerator cars and stock yards was advocated by Mr. Heney as the only means of placing the packers on an even footing with possible competitors and he said that even this could not cure entirely the "packer evil."

Cold storage plants had been built by the packers in all large cities, he said, so that small packers would have a means of disposing of their products.

Government regulation of the meat industry, he said is inadvisable because the regulated have a habit of

soon appointing the regulators themselves. He also said government ownership of the packing plants or extensive licensing probably would be unsuccessful. Testimony submitted by the packers during the hearings was termed by Mr. Heney as a virulent and unjustified attack on the federal trade commission. He said the packers had made many misrepresentations and called attention to their statement that they had not been allowed to state their side of the case during the commission's investigation. None of the packers requested that he be heard at any time, the witness said. Mr. Heney also denied statements that the commission had made misuse of the packers' correspondence files and much of its evidence had been secured from uninformed persons or disgruntled employees of the packers.
