NEW YORK, Feb. 15What in substance amounted to a very disas- trous rout of the short interests marked the course of today's brief but very lively session of the stock exchange. Prices were little more than firm at the outset, but the general tist soon strengthened under the impe- tus of a buoyant demand for oils, shippings and some of the motors and popular equipments. Rails were hesitant for a time, the weakness of St. Paul common and preferred causing irregularity in that quarter. Later, however, transcon- tinentals and coalers joined the up- ward movement, at gains of one to two points. United States steel advanced 1% to 91%, its best quotation thus far this month, allied issues rising 1 to 2½ points. Marine preferred again led the speculatives reaching 73% on further intimation of an aproaching settlement of pending negotiations. Sales amounted to 425,000 shares Bonds were active and steady in the main, speculative issues making lit- tle response to the activity of stocks. Sales, par value, \$6,675,000.
