Corn Prices Take Sharp Upward Trend With Snow
CHICAGO, Feb. 20.—Corn prices ran up sharply today owing in a considerable degree to snowstorms, rain and sleet west of the Mississippi. The market closed firm, 3 to 3 1/2 net higher, with May 1.24 1/2 to 1.64 1/2, and July 1.19 1/2 to 1.19 3/4. Oats gained to 1 1/2 @ 1/4 and provisions 50c to \$1.
Oats advanced in sympathy with corn.
All provisions rose to the limit allowed.

Stock Market Registers Another General Advance
NEW YORK, Feb. 20.—Under further guidance of pools and professional operators, the stock market today registered another fairly general advance, transactions attaining the largest proportions of any session thus far this year.
Crisis motors, equipments, tobaccos, leathers, shipping, fertilizers and a varied assortment of unclassified specialties were again singled out for bullish attention at gains of two to nine points.
High grade rails were sluggish, forfeiting their nominal gains at first indications of pressure and a few of the low priced transportations also yielded at the end, with coppers, which weakened on reports of additional cuts in the metal market.
The entire list fell back in the final dealings. Sales were 85,000 shares.
The general bond market, including Liberty and foreign issues was firm. Total sales, par value, aggregated \$12,875,000. Old United States bonds were unchanged on call.

Fullerton Indicted on Five Charges of Libel
EUGENE, Ore., Feb. 20.—James Fullerton, a farmer living near here, was arrested today on the charge of criminally libeling President P. L. Campbell, of the University of Oregon, Dr. John Straub, dean of men at the University, Governor James Withycombe, secretary of State Ben Olcott, Superintendent of Public Instruction J. A. Churchill, the board of regents of the university and the students of the institution.
The alleged libelous statements have been printed in almost every issue of a small monthly paper published by Fullerton here for the past two years. Fullerton was indicted by the Lane county grand jury on five counts.
