Ben Selling Acknowledges Receipt in Letter to Rev. H. N. Aldrich



Belt has granted a permanent injunction against the Spaulding Logging company from operating under its franchise on the Luckiamute river in this county. Judge Belt holding that the law enacted by the 1917 session of the legislature empowering the public service commission to grant franchises to logging companies to operate splash dams and flood streams for the purpose of floating logs is unconstitutional and that the legislature cannot delegate the power to grant franchises i to a commission but only to a county court, a city council or other leg-

islative body. The injunction was brought by J. F. Logan who owns and operates a grist mill on the above named river in the Kings Valley country.
