## HEADLONG RUSH

### TUMBLES GRAIN

Prices Drop With Increased  
Attempts to Sell—Corn  
and Pork Hit Hardest

CHICAGO, April 29.—Overwhelm-  
ing rushes to sell swept all grain  
and provision prices headlong today  
on the board of trade.

The biggest fall was in corn and  
pork, respectively 11 1/2c a bushel  
and 18c a barrel. Action which the  
board of trade officials and the fed-  
eral wheat director had initiated  
against excessive cost of foodstuffs  
did much to force the avalanche of  
unloading. Besides a long threat-  
ened free movement of corn and  
hogs from rural sources had finally  
unerved speculators who for months  
have been winners by anticipating  
the skyward flight of the market.

Closing prices of corn were excited  
at the lowest point of the session,  
net decline of 9 1/2 to 11 1/2c, with  
July \$1.53 1/2 to \$1.54 1/2 and Sep-  
tember \$1.51 to \$1.51 1/2. Oats lost  
2 1/2 to 3 1/2c and up provisions 20c  
to 18c. Weakness of prices in the  
corn market was evident as trading  
opened. On the downward plunge  
of values, stop-loss orders to sell  
owing to exhausted margins were un-  
covered in profusion. At this jun-  
cture when the pit was already sem-  
idemolished, announcement was  
made that the government would  
largely discontinue purchases of  
wheat flour for export and if nec-  
essary to stop speculative fever for  
high prices would throw off all im-  
port restrictions on foreign wheat  
and flour. The immediate result was  
paralysis of demand for corn. Vi-  
olence of the breaks in the market  
now reached the acme as the closing  
gong drove the perspiring crowd  
of brokers from the floor.

Oats tumbled with corn.  
Provisions shared in the flurry  
of selling brought on by the same  
forces that swept the grain mar-  
kets downward. Buyers were hard  
to find.
