SUMMARY OF INTERNATIONAL SITUATION

Friday proved on off day in peace conference circles, as far as the council of four was concerned. President Wilson devoted the day to visits by several delegations and individuals, while Premier Lloyd George was absent from Paris, bidding farewell to a Welsh regiment that left for home.

Negotiations with the Austrian peace delegation at St. Germain are expected to begin the middle of next week. The Austrians probably will present their credentials at a meeting of the peace congress Tuesday and it is reported unofficially that the following day may witness the handing of the peace terms to the delegation.

The council of foreign ministers is continuing its labors on the details of the Austrian peace treaty connected with the question of new frontiers. The treaty, it is understood, will not deal with the disposition of Dalmatia, Istria or Rome, merely calling for Austrian renunciation of rights to these territories.

Another note from the German peace plenipotentiaries to the allied and associated powers, said to deal with the question of Alsace Lorraine, is in course of preparation by the Germans.

That the allies are regarding the eventful day when the Turks are to be reckoned with a peace is indicated by the fact that British, French, American, Italian and Greek warships with landing parties have begun a great concentration at Smyrna, Asia Minor. Allied troops also are being massed at Saloniki. The concentration at Smyrna is connected with the mandate given Greece by the peace conference to administer the affairs of the Turkish seaport, while the belief is expressed in Paris that the massing at Saloniki is connected with the enforcement of the peace terms to be presented to the Ottomans, which it is thought probably will include a demand that the Turks leave Europe.

The Chinese cabinet is reported to have tendered its resignation and President Hsu Shih Chang is said to have declined and accept.

Vienna advices reported that many persons have been killed in clashes between Serbs and Croats at Agram, capital of Croatia.

SALEM LEADER IN BIG DRIVE

Local Church Over Top, District Holds Banner in Centenary Campaign

Reports to northwest headquarters in Portland yesterday of the \$105,000.00 Methodist centenary drive were that hundreds of cities all over the country had completed their quotas and a deluge of subscriptions was pouring into New York. The Baltimore area was reported as having completed its quota of over \$7,000,000.

Close on \$500,000 has been reported through the northwest declared Dr. A. L. Howarth, associate executive secretary, with 56 churches and towns having already completed their quotas. No churches in the Portland district have yet reported, but the Salem district was the banner district of the entire northwest, 14 churches having reported that their drive quotas had been obtained or exceeded. Following are the Salem district churches reported as "over the top": Sheridan, McMinnville, Dallas, Brooks, Ballston, Fargo, First church, Salem, Yamhill, Oak Grove, Lafayette, Ahlty, Falls City, Perrydale and Carlton.

A telegraph dispatch from New York to local centenary headquarters declared that the largest individual gift reported was for \$750,000, one-half the giving entire fortune. The donor is not a Methodist.

Other big pre-campaign gifts reported in the wire in those 24,000 from Mrs. Gustavus F. Scott, Chicago; an anonymous gift of \$50,000 from New England, and three anonymous gifts of \$25,000 each from Baltimore.

The intensive financial drive of the centenary begins in Portland, as in the nation, at noon Sunday. Only members of the Methodist churches, Methodist constituency and the "Friends of Methodism" will be solicited, yet pre-campaign gifts in the northwest comprise many from all denominations, including Catholics, Presbyterians, Congregationalists and others. In practically all instances, federated churches, comprising a number of denominations which have already met their quotas in the Baptist drive and the Presbyterian New Era movement have gone over the top in the Methodist drive.
