eastern part of the city where the remains of Jason Lee, his family and those of many other pioneers rest.

Mr. Parrish was at one time president of Willamette university, and also had the distinction of serving on the first board of trustees. Others named on this board were: Rev. Jason Lee, Rev. David Leslie, Rev. G. Hines, Rev. H. L. Judson, George Abernathy, Alanson Beers, H. Campbell, and Dr. J. L. Babcock. Mr. Parrish was also one of a committee of three to draw up a prospectus to present to the public, and a constitution and code of laws for government of the university.

Beers Provisional Governor  
Alanson Beers was another pioneer whose life was closely allied with the university in its infancy, and who is directly represented in Salem by a son, Oliver Beers, of 1944 Center street. The elder Mr. Beers came to Oregon around Cape Horn in 1837 on the Lausanne, with his wife being sent with a group composed of Dr. Elijah White, and wife, Miss Ann Maria Pittman, Miss Susan Downing, Miss Elvira Johnson and W. H. Wilson, as assistant missionaries.

Mr. Beers was the first provisional governor Oregon, his name now occupying a place of honor on the memorial tablet at Champoug. He was also prominently connected with a number of important business undertakings in Salem, including the first woolen mills.

Jason Lee stayed with the Beers family at one time, upon his departure presenting his host with a writing desk that has been handed down, and is preserved by the present generation as a very precious heirloom.

The part these pioneers played in the history of Salem is surely worth recalling, and it is particularly fitting that their names should be perpetuated, as they will be in the forthcoming pageant and in those that it is proposed to give hereafter, for Salem folk, for the most part are assured that the event could, and

when Commissioner Warren was unavoidably called east. For the meeting proposed at that time the governor issued a general invitation, so that all persons who wished to be

heard might have their desire gratified. The governor is now repeating his invitation to all those who have any interest in the questions at issue, or who have information to

give that may throw light on the controversy.

"It is my wish to get at the heart of this fish and game situation," said Governor Olcott yesterday in announcing that a second meeting has been called. "I wish to hear every side of it and to ascertain definitely as to whether or not the fish and game laws are being properly administered, and whether or not the fish and game of the state are being conserved to the greatest possible degree.

The matter will be gone into thoroughly. If any complaints are to be made I wish to hear them. If any defense is to be made I wish to hear that. This hearing will be free, frank, open and above board and is to be held with the hope that it will rebound to the best interests of the state."
