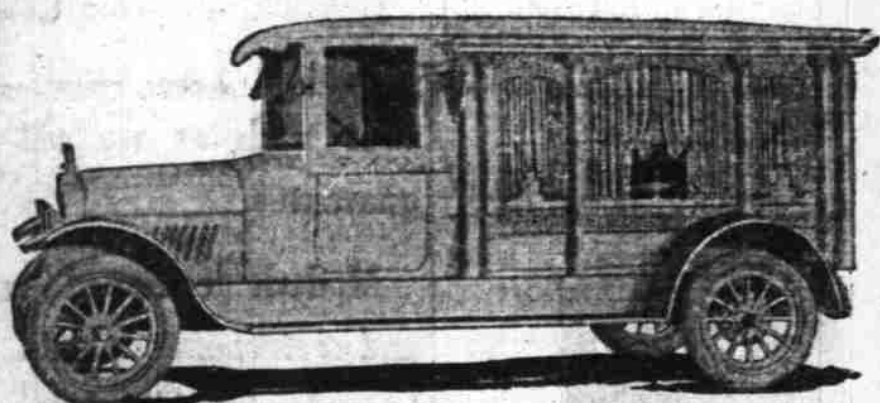

"Grease Paint Girl" of the A. E. F.
Keeps Hundreds of Shows Outfitted



It would be a wise mother who could recognize her son after Miss Winifred E. White, New York musician and now a Y.M.C.A. secretary in France, has transformed him for one of the hundreds of theatrical entertainments which the boys overseas give every month. Not that Miss White herself turns him into a negro, a chorus girl or a dialect comedian, but she does furnish every bit of grease paint used for making up the doughboys in their shows in France.

Whenever a burlesque is put on at Tours, a minstrel show at Le Mans, or a "jazz revue" at Chaumont, a request is rushed to the "grease paint girl" at her office at No. 10, Rue d'Elysee, Paris, along with a list of the characters in the play. Miss White rushes back the necessary grease paint to metamorphose the soldiers into the characters. When it is considered that in one month 1,352 costumes were loaned to soldiers for amateur shows, and that the "Y" sent out 1,184 musical instruments and furnished 280 plays, it will be seen that Miss White has some job.

In addition to her grease paint department, the "Y" girl also has under her supervision a file of songs, band orchestrations, monologues and plays. In this work she has begun a movement that is making her more popular than ever. She is making arrangements for all "Y" secretaries going to France to take with them a number of copies of the latest American song hits. Soon the boys will not have to depend on letters from friends at home for the names of the latest songs. They'll be singing them in France.

MISS SUSANNA COCROFT

Backed by government authorities headed by Rear-Admiral Cary T. Grayson, President Wilson's personal physician, Miss Susanna Cocroft of Chicago is to continue her wartime work of keeping women feeling young. In experiments with thousands of women war workers Miss Cocroft proved her ideas worth while. As a result the United States training corps was organized. It is estimated that this summer 50,000 young women will be under her direction in camps in various sections of the country. Better health for the future mothers of the land will be the result of the movement, says Miss Cocroft.

Marshmallows. — One envelope granulated gelatin, one and one-fourth cups water, two cups fine granulated sugar, a few grains salt, one teaspoon vanilla. Soak gelatin in one-half the water five minutes. Put remaining water and sugar in saucepan, bring to the boiling point and let boil until syrup will spin a thread when dropped from tip of spoon. Add soaked gelatin and let stand until partially cooled; then add salt and flavoring. Heat until mixture becomes white and thick. Pour into granite pans, thickly dusted with powdered sugar, having mixture one inch in depth. Let stand until thoroughly chilled. Turn on a board, cut in cubes and roll in powdered sugar.
