The contract was made in 1917. for five years, at 3 cents a pound It is understood, however, that The Phez Cempany is willing to pay a voluntary increase of two and a half cents a pound for this season's crop of the growers involved.

For the growers, it is understood that the Salem Fruit Union will contend that there is no existing contract; that it has been broken.
