CORN AND OATS GIVEN SETBACK

**Better Crop Prospects and
Break in Hog Market
Responsible**

CHICAGO, June 17.—Sharp set-
backs in the value of corn today re-
sulted largely from excellent weath-
er conditions for the growing crop.
The close was unsettled, 3/4c to 2 1/2c
net lower, with July \$1.15 1/2 to
\$1.17 1/2, and September \$1.68 1/2 to
\$1.69. Oats 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 down and
provisions off 3/4c to 5c.

In addition to the bearish influ-
ence of better crop prospects, a de-
cided break in hog quotations tended
to force the corn market lower, ow-
ing to the shrinkage of feeding prof-
it thus rendered certain.

Oats weakened with corn. Coun-
try dealers were moderate buyers on
the break.

Provisions were depressed in con-
sequence of further bearish action
of cereals and hogs. Besides, an
increase was shown in the semi-
monthly statement of warehouse
stocks here and it was said that
shipping demand both domestic and
export was rather slow.
