CORN AGAIN ON UPWARD TREND Estimates of Reduced Acreage Gives Strength to Quotations CHICAGO, June 18.--Estimates that the planted corn land in the eight largest states had been reduced in extent this year about 8,000,000 acres made all deliveries of corn jump today to the highest prices yet this season. The market closed strong at 2 1/2c to 4 1/2c net gain, with July \$1.72 1/2 to 4 1/2c net and September \$1.72 1/2 to \$1.72c. Oats finished 1 1/2c to 1 1/2c up. In provisions, the outcome raised from 65c decline to a rise of 2 1/2c. Fear of crop damage gave some independent strength to oats. As in corn trade were weak owing to the sharp declines in the value of hogs. Besides, foreign news concerning lard was bearish.
