\$300 WORTH OF 'DOPE' STOLEN

Thieves Strip Schaefer Drug Store of All Cocaine, Morphine and Heroin

Every ounce of "dope" in the drug store of Emil A. Schaefer, amounting to more than \$300 worth of drugs, was stolen last night by burglars who obviously had made a careful study of the store.

Drugs stolen were morphine, cocaine and heroin and included 1000 bottles of morphine tablets.

Entrance to the store was effected by "jimmying" open a steel door at the rear of the store and cutting through a glass door to gain access to the lock. The thieves then apparently went directly to the case containing the drugs, cleared its shelves and made away in short order.

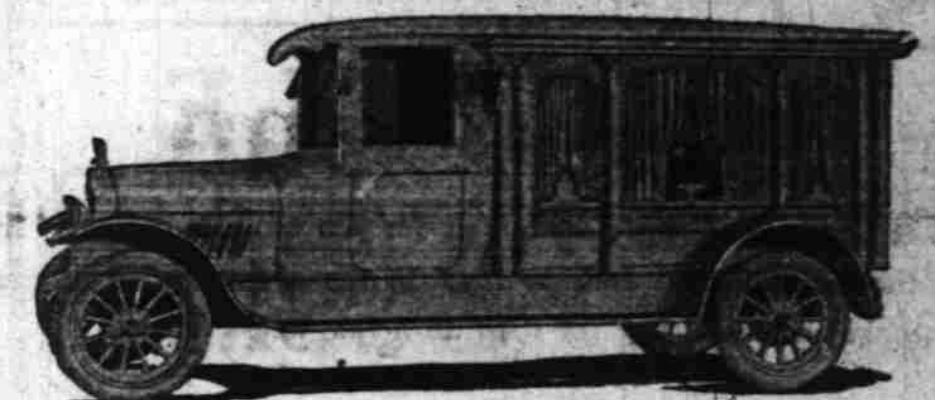
