Baby Daughter Arrives.

Estate Closed.
The estate of Frank A. Geelan has been declared closed and the administrator discharged.

Charged with Non-Support.
Owen Tarbler, who is charged with the non-support of a 2-year-old child, was brought before Judge Unruh yesterday and will have his hearing on next Tuesday at 10 a. m.

Suit Dismissed.
The case of the state vs. Mrs. H. Grim, charged with the theft of a tent from Bruce Cunningham, has been dismissed. The case came up in Judge Unruh's court yesterday, but the woman easily proved that she was not the one who took the tent and the case was dismissed.

Tracy Case Comes up Again.
The case of the state vs. G. H. Tracy, charged with selling short cords of wood to the Odd Fellows lodge, will come up for hearing Saturday at 10 a. m. The case came up in the justice court some time ago and was dismissed for lack of evidence.

Fishing Poor on Abiqua.
Dr. Carl G. Doney and son Paul and Professor and Mrs. Gustav Ehsen have returned from a three days fishing trip to Abiqua and Butte creeks. They report the fishing poor but state that the outing was a very pleasant one.

Methodist Steeple Being Repaired.
Extensive repairs are being made to the steeple of the First Methodist church, as the tin work in all the joints has rusted out and let the water through. Scaffolding has been placed about the steeple at a distance of over 100 feet from the ground and the minarets are being repaired as well as the main tower. When the work is finished on the exterior considerable interior decoration will be undertaken.

Defendant Given Decree.
A decree was handed down yesterday in the circuit court in the case entitled Ralph Landers and Arthur Landers vs. Bertha Landers sustaining the title of the defendant in a 20-acre farm in Marion county. The plaintiffs alleged in their complaint that when their father purchased the land in 1900 from the Salem Fuel company for \$300 they were promised an interest in the land if they would help him cut and haul the wood on it. When the father died in 1918 he left the whole tract to Bertha Landers, who was his second wife, and gave only \$5 to each of his sons. The decision upholds the will and does not sustain the contention of the sons.

Suit Authorized.
In the estate of Frank Harding an order of the court authorizing the administrator, Clare Harding, to bring suit against the Poe & Devereaux company for the alleged cancellation of a contract. The petition for the order states that some time before his death Mr. Harding gave the company power of attorney and that by virtue of that authority the company later purchased timber lands in Lane county, representing that the price paid was \$38,000, whereas the petition alleges the real
