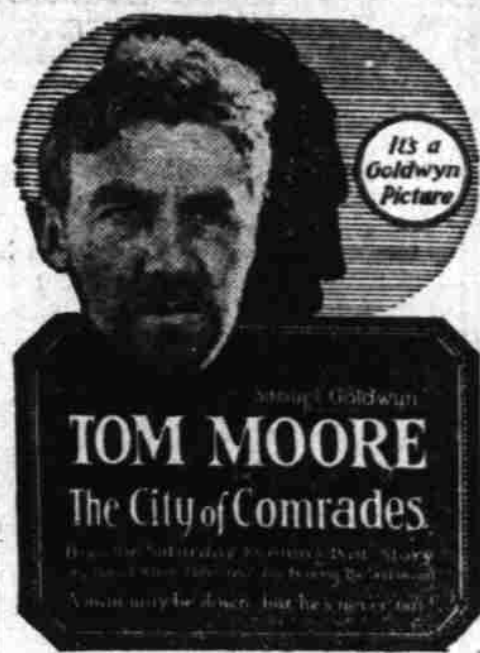
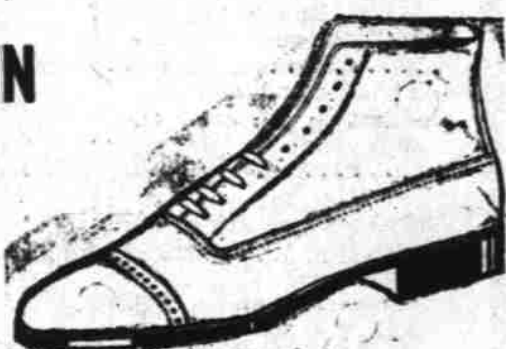

BOARD HEARS CHARGES MADE BY CUMMINGS

quiry, while Mr. Cummings insisted that the Republicans in control of congress were trying to criticize every single act of the administration during the war. The committee chairman brought out that prior to 1896 the witness was a Republican. He told how he and Mr. Magee and Representative Lea, Democrat of California, members of the committee, had protested against being forced to travel to the Pacific coast next month. Mr. Frear said he had been to the coast over every railroad so the trip was no "junket" to him.

There was great need, Chairman Frear proceeded, for an inquiry into the forthcoming sale of millions of dollars worth of government property. He presented a letter from Senator Chamberlain of Oregon, enclosing pictures of lumber engines lying in ditches along the railroad track. Examining them for a moment the witness remarked: "They are hardly worth sending this committee to look at," but added that he did not wish to be understood as depreciating investigation of any war activities.

Investigations Please. Mr. Magee wanted to know if Mr. Cummings, as chairman of the Democratic organization, feared the results of the inquiry.

"Quite the contrary, my dear sir," he replied. "I look forward with great pleasure to these investigations. The leaders of the Republican party are doing us a great service. But I think you are on the wrong track and that's why you have my sympathy. I am in favor of the Republicans investigating everything the Democrats did. I believe you gentlemen are actuated by high motives, but the whole thing will come to naught."

demanding that the blacks be delivered to them.

400 Whites Beat Black. About 400 whites beat one of three negroes severely at 47th street and Vincennes avenue this afternoon. The other two, both armed, escaped after firing a few shots.

Mayor Thompson, in spite of a decrease in violence asked the city council for 2,000 additional permanent policemen. The council took no definite action.

Troops Number 6500. Chief Gharrity announced that 1,800 special policemen would go on duty tomorrow. The troops now on active duty number approximately 6,500 with the greater part of two regiments, the Fourth reserve militia and the 9th national guard still on reserve in armories.

With the lessening of violence public officials became more active in investigation of the riots and their causes. Attorney General Brundage and State's Attorney Hoyne are co-operating in obtaining evidence for a grand jury investigation.

HUMAN INTEREST STRONG POINT

Thrilling Chase of Convict Woman is Pathetically Depicted

There are many heart-stirring moments in "A Heart in Pawn", Sessuo Hayakawa's most recent production. The night scenes in Japan—particularly the thrilling chase of the convict woman after her escape from prison, are wondrously beautiful, and only the master hand of artistry could reproduce so realistically the power and exotic beauty of the mystic orient.

Many of the scenes were actually taken in Japan shortly before Hayakawa formed his own producing company, The Haworth Pictures corporation, and preserved for use in his productions.

There are a number of Japanese children who are delightfully unconscious and naive, and a group of genuine Geisha girls who dance in the tea house scene.
