"It might be well to direct the attention of these honorably disa special session meets with Con- charged soldiers, sailors and marines who are entitled to the benefits of the financial educational aid law." said Mr. Kozer, "to the fact that their applications must be made directly to the head of the institution of learning, whether public or private, in which they desire to pursue a course of study, and that in order to secure information regarding its requirements and benefits, they make their inquiries of the head of such institution which they desire to attend. By following a course of this kind, they will undoubtedly save themselves much delay in obtaining the information which they desire.

"It might also be well to state here that the benefits of this law are not paid directly by the state to the soldier, sailor or marine. At the end of each month he is required to render a statement of his expenditures during that period to the executive head of the institution which he is attending. That individual renders a statement to the secretary of state of the monthly amounts which are certified to him by those attending his institution and receiving the benefits of the financial educational aid law, which is audited the same as other claims against the state. The head of this institution is responsible for the moneys of the soldier, sailor or marine, who must look to the head of the institution he is attending for the assistance which he is entitled to under the law."
