Mr. Vanderbilt, youngest son of the late Cornelius Vanderbilt, inherited a share of his father's estate estimated at \$10,000,000. Later he received \$5,000,000 by the will of his brother, Alfred Gwynne Vanderbilt, who perished on the Lusitania. Mrs. Vanderbilt was Miss Cathleen Gebhard Neilson, daughter of Mrs. Frederick H. Neilson.
