

While the law appropriates the equivalent of two-tenths of a mill annually on the taxable property of the state, it was not effective until June 4, 1919, consequently it will not be possible to include this sum on the revenues of the state until the next tax levy is made by the state tax commission in December. 1919 for the fiscal year 1920, and by reason thereof the money will not becoe available until January 1 1920. After that date, however, all claims of institutions furnishing aid under the law since it became operative June 4, 1919, will be paid from the money available at that time. In view of this condition it becomes necessary on the part of those educational institutions which do not have funds, to arrange to tide them over until state moneys are avail-
