FAKE ADS HIT BY METHODISTS

Laymen Object to Some Matter Appearing in Denominational Papers

Fake and objectionable advertising appearing in publications of the Methodist church is hit by the laymen of the Salem district who have formulated a laymen's organization. They condemn as unbusinesslike and contrary to the ideals of the church some of the advertising matter that is allowed to appear.

The laymen have organized in accordance with a recommendation of Rev. T. B. Ford, superintendent of the Salem district. Roy B. Cox of Oregon City has been elected president, L. S. Hopfield of McMinnville vice president, and A. C. Bohmstedt of Salem secretary and treasurer. Among the objects of the organization appear the following:

To enlist laymen of the churches of the district in the activities of the church, particularly the evangelistic and other forward movements, including the centenary world program; the introduction of better business methods in the church; promotion of a closer cooperation between the churches of the district; to relieve the ministry of responsibilities which belong to the laymen; to promote more and better church advertising; to promote social intercourse between the churches; to encourage and help maintain the minute men of the church; to back up financially and in every other way

the young people of the church in their work and activities.

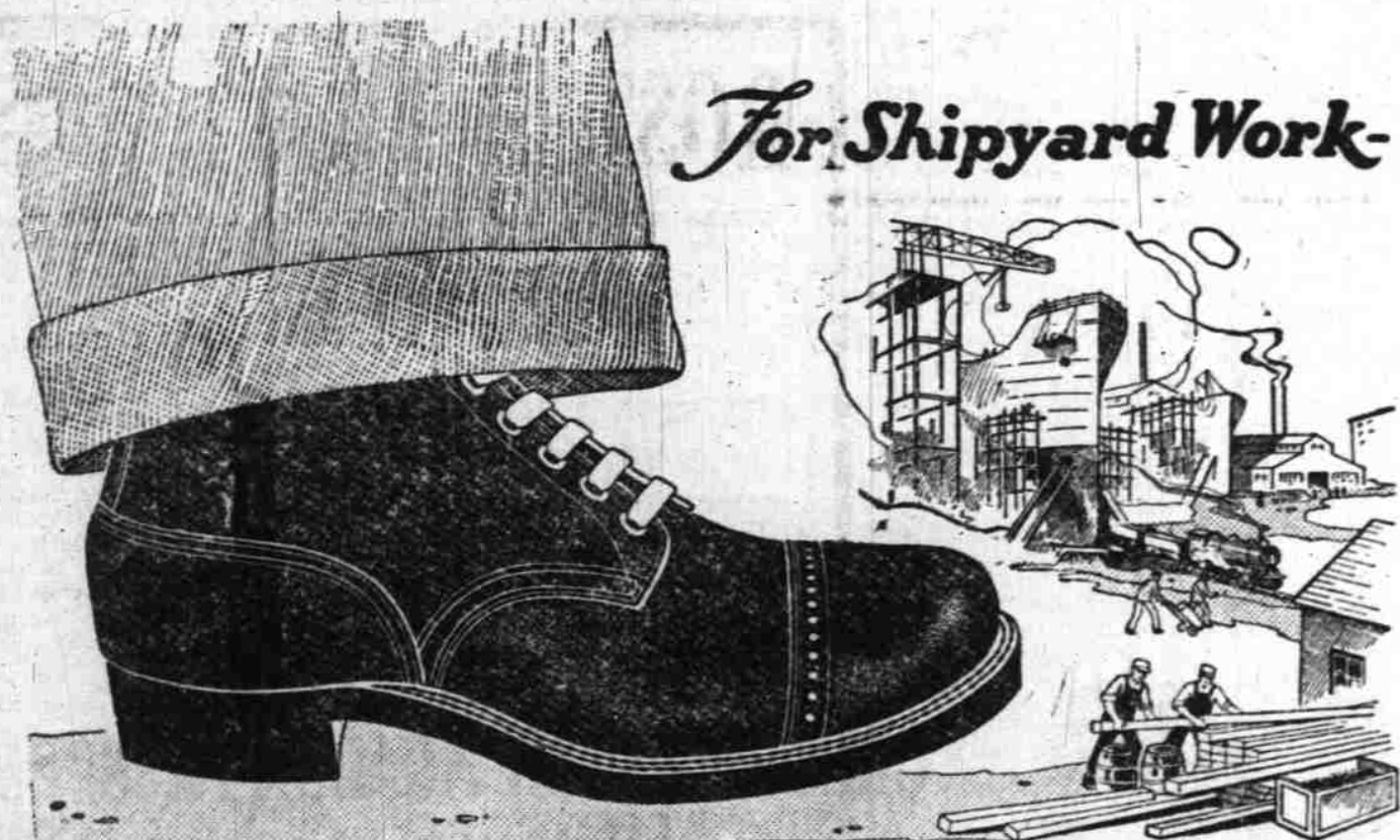
