**KLAMATH POST IS UP IN ARMS**

**Thirty-Year Leases, Tying Up Thousands of Acres, Are Under Protest**

Action to influence federal and state officials to cancel leases that have been granted, covering a period of 30 years, on about 10,000 acres of marsh lands in the environs of Upper Klamath lake has been instituted through resolutions by Klamath Post No. 8, American legion. The post wishes the land thrown open to entry for men who served the country in the World war. Attorney General Brown received a copy of the resolutions yesterday.

Other copies have been sent to members of the Oregon delegation in congress, Senators Borah and Johnson, Secretary of the Interior Franklin K. Lane, the chairman of the public lands committee of the United States senate and to Governor Olcott.

"Had the bids been opened for reclamation of these lands," says the resolution, "with the provision that the reclamation costs should be charged against the lands and paid by actual settlers, this post could not have so seriously objected to this proposition. But in view of the fact that this vast area of the best land in this country is to be tied up for more than a generation when discharged men are in serious need of lands for homes, makes us unite to a man in the request that said leases be cancelled and the lands opened up to entry by ex-service men."
