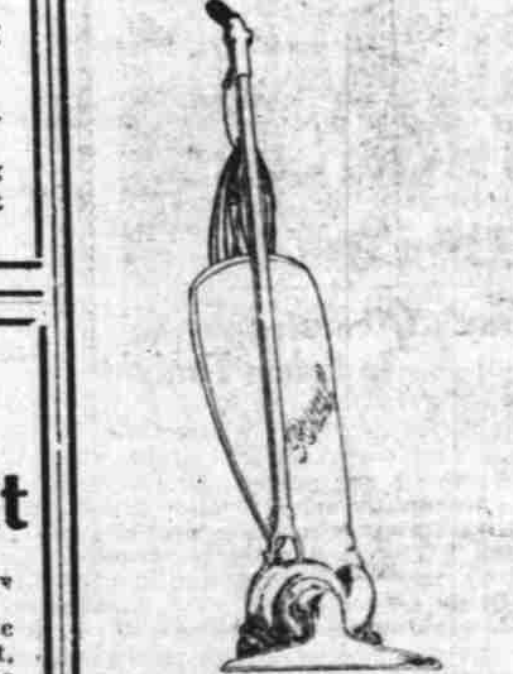
**Inheritance Tax Fixed—**
