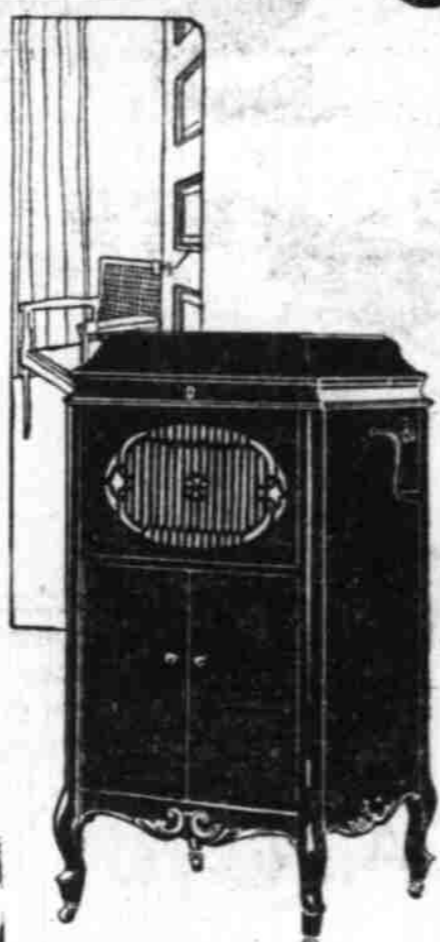
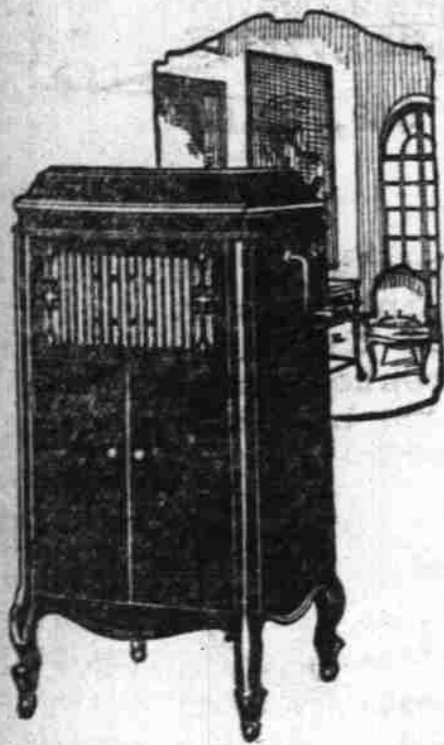

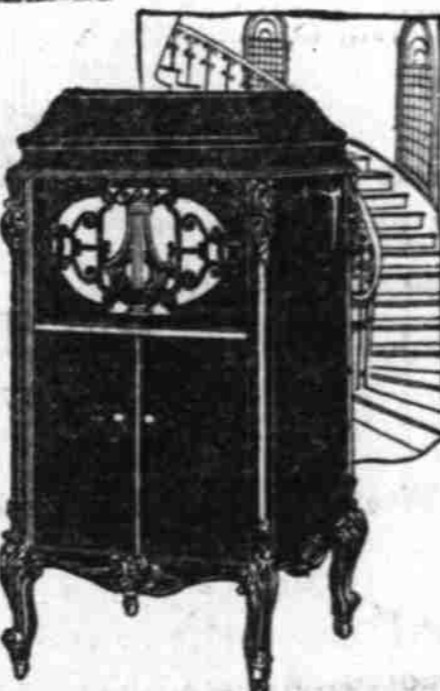

**Uniform Traffic Laws
Plan of Mr. Ekward**

Agitation which was begun some time ago favoring uniform traffic laws for Oregon, Washington and California, has begun to take definite shape with the arrival here yesterday of Senator F. S. Ekward of California, author of the motor vehicle laws of that state. He will be here several days making a study of the Oregon laws. He will carry the scheme for uniform laws for the coast states before the three legislatures in 1921.
