Aleta D. Shaw et al, appellants, vs. J. R. Corbett, appeal from Baker county, suit arising out of alleged failure to comply with terms of lease relative to sale of real estate, livestock and farm machinery; opinion by Justice Barnett; Judge Gustav Anderson reversed.

Augusta Klesendahl et al vs. H. L. Ganoe, et al, appellants; appeal from Multnomah county; suit to terminate a trust and for an accounting and damages for the maladministration thereof; opinion by Justice Barnett; decree of Judge Cavanaugh modified by adding \$450 to the credit of Ganoe and by making the reconveyance of the property subject to and upon a satisfaction of the note given by the trustee to the Northwestern National bank for \$300 and \$250 respectively, or any renewals of the same after allowing for all payments which have been made out of the trust fund.
