**BIDS ON TRUCKS ARE RECEIVED**

**County Commissioners Have Long List From Which to Make Award**

Bids were received by the county commissioners yesterday for the new trucks to be purchased by the county. There were many firms competing for the award and in all there were 31 bids submitted. In accordance with the road program the county commissioners are authorized to purchase 10 heavy delivery trucks of three and one-half tons capacity. These trucks will be allotted to the different paving plants throughout the county.

Owing to the variety of equipment and discounts for the acceptance of more than one truck entered in the different bids, the county commissioners will be unable to decide on the awards for some time.

Bids for 10 trucks ranged from \$3,500 to \$57,000. The Salem Velle company, offering the Bethlehem truck, appeared to be the lowest with a bid for \$35,500. Next lowest were Huggan & Co. of Portland, offering 10 Federal trucks for \$40,450, and Otto Wilson of Salem, offering Republic trucks at \$40,700.
