ALAMEDA HAS \$200,000 FIRE

Fears Felt for Business District but Flames Are Controlled After Fight

ALAMEDA, Calif., Jan. 8.—Fire which started in the center of Alameda's business district at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon did what is estimated to \$200,000 damage before it was reported under control two hours later. For a while it was feared the entire business section would be destroyed as well as a portion of the residence section. Fire tugs from San Francisco and from Southern Pacific yards aided the Alameda and Oakland fire departments. The principal damage was in one block. Only four buildings are left in this block. It is not known how the fire started.

EX-NEBRASKA GOVERNOR DIES

Ezra Perin Savage, Boyhood Friend of W. F. Cody Is Dead

TACOMA, Wash., Jan. 8.—Ezra Perin Savage, who as governor of Nebraska, officiated at the lying in the keel of the battleship Nebraska at Seattle in 1902, died here this afternoon at the age of 77. He had lived quietly in Tacoma for the past 1 year after a long career as a legislator in Nebraska and in the grain and cattle business in Nebraska. A boyhood associate of William F. Cody (Buffalo Bill), he served with the famous plainsman as a scout in the Civil war and as a soldier in the armies of Grant and Sherman. Surviving the former governor are his widow, Mrs. Julia Savage; three sons, H. S. Savage of Wenatchee; H. P. Savage of Prosser and Charles G. Savage of McNeil Island; two daughters, Mrs. Charles James of Kansas City, and Mrs. Charles Tucker of Tacoma; and two sisters, Mrs. Delphine Kelly of Puyallup, Wash., and Mrs. Samuel Correy of Chicago.

DRAFT EVADER ENTERS PRISON

"Lone Star" Dietz Begins 30-Day Term for False Answers

SPOKANE, Wash., Jan. 8.—William H. (Lone Star) Dietz, today began serving a thirty day sentence in the county jail here following his plea in United States district court of nolo contendere to an indictment of falsifying his draft questionnaire. Dietz, who formerly was coach of the Washington State college football team and the Mare Island Marine corps team, was charged by the government with having stated in his questionnaire that he was a non-citizen Indian, born on the Pine Ridge Indian reservation in South Dakota, had received a government Indian allotment, and that he was engaged in a necessary occupation. All this the government denied. A jury in the United States district court here disagreed in Dietz's trial on a similar indictment and was dismissed last June 26. He was re-indicted the same day by a grand jury.
