FIUME TO GET SOVEREIGNTY

Report in Buenos Aires Says City to be Entity Under League of Nations

BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 8.—Great Britain, France and the United States conceding the Italian character of Fiume, will grant that city complete sovereignty under the league of nations, preserving only a customs union with Jugo-Slavia, according to a memorandum concerning Dalmatia and Fiume, recently presented by those powers to Vittorio Scialoja, the Italian foreign minister. A summary of the memorandum, telegraphed by its Rome correspondent, is published by La Nacion today.

Washington Women Declare Boycott Use Unnecessary

SEATTLE, Wash., Jan. 8.—Washington women, representing clubs and civic organizations throughout the state, meeting here today to plan means for reducing living costs, adopted a platform calling for "simple living" and "sane buying" as opposed to reckless expenditure for luxuries, and launched a state-wide campaign to teach economy and conservation. The use of the boycott as a means to check profiteering was condemned as dangerous and unnecessary.
