Walnut-Pear Property Sold
Frank Davey, office manager for Pearcey Brothers, returned last night from Portland where he spent the past two days closing up arrangements for the sale of an 80-acre walnut and pear orchard near Sheridan in Yamhill county. Besides the orchard there are still 80 acres still uncleared. The planting was made and owned by J. B. Pilkington of Portland and W. E. Schimpff of Astoria, and has been purchased by H. M. Sterling and C. E. Andrew of Portland, who intend to devote considerable personal attention to it and ultimately to make a home there. Mr. Sterling and his wife spent a good portion of this winter in California among the fruit and walnut groves of that state and decided that Oregon properties suited them better. Mr. Andrew is a civil engineer connected with the United States highway department and Mr. Sterling has been a salesman of machinery for several years. Both want a chance to get into the country, where they can have relaxation from the city grind and at the same time have a profitable investment. The place they have bought is in grafted franquette walnuts with Bartlett and Anjou pears as fillers and the location is said to be delightful from a scenic point of view. They have arranged with Pearcey Brothers to give the orchard a scientific pruning and other needed treatment as soon as possible. The purchase price was in the neighborhood of \$30,000.
