When the French market was flooded recently with fresh eggs at remarkably low prices the profiteers were panic-stricken. The cause of their troubles was Prince Louis de Bourbon, descendant of a long line of kings, and a cousin of King Alfonso of Spain. He says that by intelligent poultry farming he succeeded in maintaining hens at a cost of one cent a day. Each of his hens has laid a minimum of 150 eggs a year. On that basis he can sell eggs at slightly more than two cents apiece and make a good profit. The prince intends to go into poultry farming on a much larger scale than formerly. The photograph shows him with his beautiful wife, the former Miss Beatrice Harrington, who shares his interest in routing the egg profiteers.
