#### Woman Accused of Reckless Driving Freed by Jury in Portland Court

#### JURY UNABLE TO AGREE

#### Tom Garland Puts One Over on Ted Lansing, Representing State

PORTLAND, Feb. 5.—When a jury of six men in circuit Judge Morrow's court today found it could not reach a decision in the case of Elsie Howie, charged with driving an automobile while intoxicated, E. Y. Lansing Jr., deputy city attorney,

and Attorney Thomas Garland, representing Mrs. Howie, decided to compromise with the result that Mrs. Howie was freed. "Come on, dismiss the charge," said Garland to Lansing, when the jury announced it could not agree. "Have her plead guilty," countered the deputy. "If the majority favors conviction I will," returned Garland. "If they are for acquittal I will dismiss the charge," said Lansing, and the pair shook hands on the agreement. Judge Morrow consented, the jury announced that their last vote stood four to two for acquittal. The case was dismissed. Circuit Judge Gatens, another Portland judge, some time ago caused considerable newspaper comment by flipping a coin to determine which of two men convicted on the same charge of robbery, should be given the longer sentence, as it was thought advisable that they be set free at different times.

#### Deposed Portland Official May Get Final Hearing Before Senate

#### DEMOCRATS ARE ACTIVE

#### Investigation of Dismissal Assured in Telegram From Committeeman

PORTLAND, Feb. 5.—A United States senator who is a member of the committee on postoffices and post roads but whose name is withheld for the present has telegraphed Gilbert E. Hamaker, chairman of the county democratic committee, that he will endeavor to have the case of Frank S. Myers, who was ousted as postmaster of Portland referred to the senate committee on postoffices and post roads for an investigation so that Myers can get a hearing, Hamaker said today. Myers was dismissed by order of President Wilson at the close of business Saturday, January 31, without any hearing or without any complaint being lodged against him by the postoffice department, Myers asserts.

#### Kansas Red Sox, Moosejaw and Regina Clubs May Tangle With Senators

The diamond trippers of Salem will be known as the Salem Senators, which was the name decided upon at a meeting of the organizers of the team recently. This name is the same that was applied to the team in Salem about five years ago. Manager Bishop has already made tentative plans for the first game of the season. It is expected that the Senators will play the first game with the Moosejaw team of the Western Canadian league which will be in training near Portland, or the Regina team of the same league which is also to train near Portland. The date is not decided upon but it is probable that the first week in March will catch the Senators in action with one of the above mentioned teams. It is definitely decided that the Salem baseball fans will see some fast games with the foremost teams of the west and south in action here. Joe Randall was in Salem recently. He is manager of a semi-professional team at Sacramento, Calif., and a long, sociable parley was spent with Manager Bishop, dickering about bringing the Sacramento team here to find out a few of the rudiments of baseball, while on tour of the northwest that will take the California team as far north as Montana. It is quite probable that games will be arranged with this team. The Kansas Red Sox will make a tour of the northwest and a game or two may be staged with them.

Practice of the Senators will begin not later than the last of this month. The probable lineup is on hand and the team is virtually completed. Although a number of well known baseball men are slated for the team, Manager Bishop asks that the local boys be not backward about coming forward and signing up, as this is a local team and all the local boys will be given the same chance and encouragement that the old players will get.

The Senators are trying to obtain the high school grounds near Twelfth street, and if this location is annexed the grounds will be improved with a new stack of bleachers, the diamond cleaned and made larger, and many other improvements added. The only regret of this choice instead of the old field, near the penitentiary, is that the boys will not have the satisfaction of nicking the pill into the mill race, except by foul.

### BISHOPS BUY ANOTHER MILL

#### Plant at Eureka, Calif., Is Taken Over by Salem and Pendleton Men

PENDLETON, Or., Feb. 4.—The rehabilitation of five dormant woolen mills and the establishment of one new mill is the record of C. P. Bishop & Sons, completed with the purchase of the Humboldt Bay Woolen Mill at Eureka, Calif., the formal announcement of which was made yesterday. The record extends over a period of 19 years, since the purchase of the property of the then idle Pendleton Woolen mills in 1909 by C. P. Bishop, C. M. Bishop and R. T. Bishop. Three years later the organization purchased at a receiver's sale,

The Washougal Woolen mills and placed them again in operation. In 1915 they purchased the equipment of the Marysville, Cal., woolen mill and added it to the equipment of the Pendleton and Washougal plants.

In 1918, R. T. Bishop, a member of the firm, organized the then dormant plant of the Oregon Worsted company at Sellwood, Or. During the past year a new plant, for the manufacture of woolen hosiery, has been established and is now in operation at Vancouver, Wash.

In this last deal, associated with the Bishops are C. P. Slade, formerly office manager of the Salem Woolen Mills store, and F. E. McGee. The latter will be superintendent of the new plant.

The machinery of the Eureka plant is designed especially for the manufacture of fine wool flannels for suitings, dress goods and shirtings and will continue to manufacture these lines. Next to the Pendleton mill, it is rated as one of the best on the coast and the company expects, with the addition of its output, to materially extend its trade on the coast and in the east.
