SHANGHAI, China, Jan. 15 .- (By Mail.)-Over \$2,000,000 will be spent in the Far East during the next four years in building up a medical system to cope with the problem of plague and pestilence in China and India. Nineteen new hospitals staffed by American doctors and nurses and furnished with mod-

ern equipment are planned, The program of medical development in the orient marks the beginning of a vast medical system by which it is hoped to create a Chinese medical profession. The training of Chinese men and women as physicians and nurses is one of the important plans involved in the under-

taking. Northern Baptists Active. Large investments are being made here by the Northern Baptist denomination in cooperation with the China medical board of the Rockefeller foundation. The Union Medical college for women at Shanghai is broadening its scope so as to be an important factor in the training of women doctors and nurses.
