

## BOYS AND THE BOY SCOUTS

Twenty-five Per Cent in Permanent Investment.

Of the proposed budget for the coming year in Salem's Boy Scout work a part will go for permanent investment in what is called a "week end cabin" and its equipment. That being done this year will not need to be done again. It will be a permanent investment because it will last for many years. It has to do with that outdoor life which is such an essential feature of scouting.

It will be a well-equipped cabin somewhere out of the city but within easy hiking distance. It will be at the service of the different troops for holidays, week-end trips, and vacation periods.

During the periods when a boy is at the cabin he will continue his study of outdoor life. Physical strength, mental alertness and moral cleanliness will be the ideal in mind as in his contact with nature he is thoroughly enjoying himself. All the things he needs to use while at

the cabin are included in the equipment of the cabin.

Twenty-five per cent of the whole budget goes into this permanent investment.

**Salaries to Be Paid.**  
Do you remember that story of the colored preacher who had preached a sermon on salvation being free and then locked the doors and kept the people till they raised the money to pay his salary. One brother rose to a point of information as to why they must pay if salvation was free.

this city should let them go no employment agency would ever hear of their wanting a job. A hundred American cities would jump at the chance to get them. Salem fussed around a good while with this Boy Scout movement on a narrow, ill-paid plan. We got no

work. The work was not developed in its scope. We still see boys that did enlist didn't get what a scout ought to have.

The Salem council faced the situation that the Allies did in the war when they put Foch in command. There had to be one head that knew the game and was equal to the demands of it. What is the result? The number of Boy Scouts in Salem has tripled in the last year. That tripled number will be doubled right now when this campaign goes over the top. Salem used to be way down in the list of American scout cities of her size. Today she is second in the state and she is going to be first.

**The Scout Executive.**  
The Salem council proposes to pay the scout executive who has thus developed the work in Salem and given the city this opportunity a salary of \$1800 for the coming year. He has consented to stay with Salem for that amount though another city offered more.

Not only must the number of the scouts be more than doubled in Salem but the standard of the work must be kept at its highest point. This demands a man familiar with every step of the national requirements.

**The Scoutmasters.**  
Every troop of scouts has its own scoutmaster. He is a volunteer worker. He is a Salem man, busy with his own work, but interested in the boys. He gives his time and energy outside of business hours to this work with the boys. There are certain things he can do. There are others he cannot do.

The things he can do depend in his knowledge how to do them. The scout executive conducts a training course for scoutmasters. That is one place where the trained knowledge of the national standards comes in. No local man could do this outside of his business hours.

The volunteer force of scoutmasters could not do what they are willing to do for Salem boys if it were not for this trained leader.

Another thing that the scoutmaster, being a volunteer worker and his time subject to business demands, cannot do is to be always ready to lead his troop in outdoor work when the boys of the troop can go. Here is where

**The Scout Executive Comes In.**  
He will have full charge of all the outdoor work. That will be his specialty, though he will help in many other ways. He will be assisted by scoutmasters when they can do it without interfering with their regular occupations.

The scout executive is a trained expert in this work of scouting.

**A Full and Regular Report.**  
The Salem council proposes that all subscribers shall have a full, frequent and regular report of just what is being done in the city along this line. They will issue a monthly paper that will carry news of value to the scoutmasters, provide an exchange between troops, and bring them items of interest from the national field, but it will go to every subscriber and give him a report of what his money is doing.

**The National Quota.**  
The scout movement in Salem is tied to and derives its charter from the national organization, which is itself chartered by an act of congress. This makes its plan of operation somewhat similar to that of the American Red Cross, with which we have all become so familiar.

So also a part of the budget must cover the national quota which provides for the missionary work in spreading the movement into cities that have no organization now. It is all used for the boy work. For the years of 1918 and 1919 this sum is \$350, which appears in the budget. As Salem could not do this work at all without the national organization, this is a reasonable amount for two years.

These are the important items of expenditure. Office rent, printing, salaries for the boys, stenographic and clerical help and a little additional office equipment make up the rest. As the money is expended from month to month you will be regularly advised of what it goes for and as to how it is used by the paper that goes to every subscriber. (To be continued next Sunday.)

### SIXTY MILLION YEARS SINCE THE FEROCIOUS DENEIDON RULED HERE

NEW YORK, Mar. 5.—The skeleton of a prehistoric deinodon, calculated to be 30,000,000 years old, has been installed in Dinosaur hall at the American Museum of Natural History. The deinodon, which is also known as "terrible-tooth," is described as perhaps the most swift and powerful creature of its time.

The skeleton stands 11 feet 5 inches high and measures 20 feet from the nose to the tip of its tail. It is supposed to have weighed several times as much as the largest lion of today.

Dr. W. T. Matthew, curator of the museum's department of vertebrate paleontology, says that the prehistoric ancestors perhaps did not have to contend with the deinodon, which likely was extinct before the earliest careman.

The deinodon lived during the cretaceous period of the era of reptiles, according to calculations based on the alteration of radioactive minerals.

The skeleton of the deinodon was found three years ago by Charles H. Sternberg in the canon of the Red Deer river, in Alberta, the richest repository of dinosaur skeletons yet discovered. The geography and climate was far different 60,000,000 years ago, perhaps warm and marshy as the broad interior sea, once stretching from the Gulf of Mexico to the Arctic ocean, was gradually receding and filling up with swamps and tropical growth.

Reptiles roamed the earth in those days, and save for tiny opossum-like creatures in the trees, there was none of the higher quadruped or mammals. It has been suggested that the tiny tree-dwellers helped

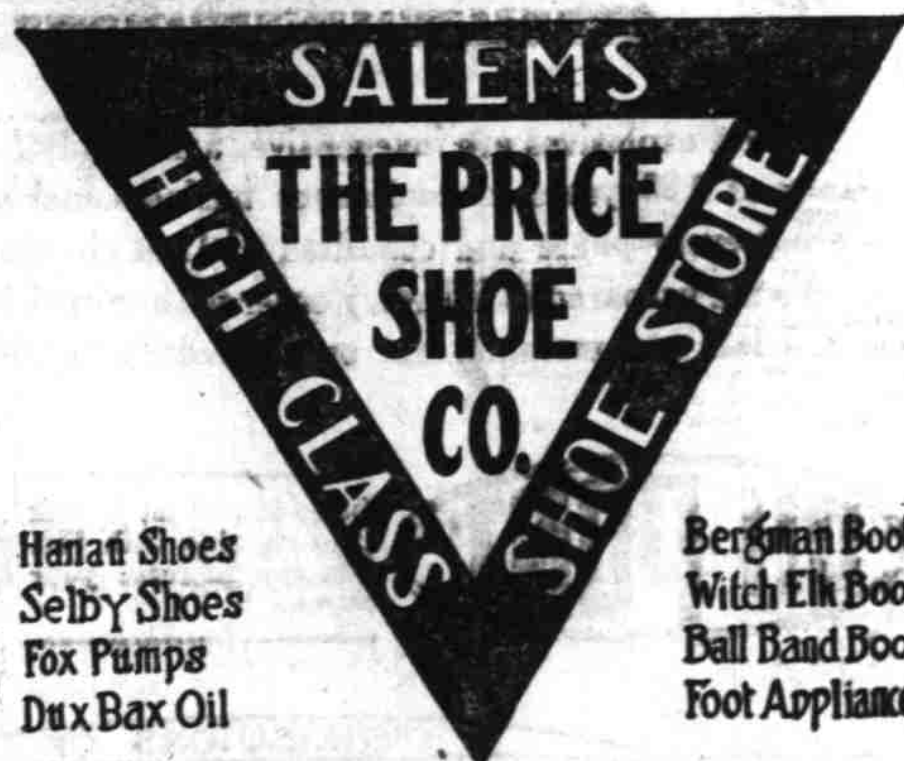
