**League Will Meet**—Announcement is made that the regular monthly meeting of the South Salem Development league will be held at the South Salem school Friday night, beginning at 7:30 o'clock. The league has been instrumental in carrying through a number of improvements in that part of the city, and other proposed improvements will be discussed tomorrow night.

**Water Applications**—Construction of a canal and other works for the development of 3544 horsepower, near Drewsey, Harney county, will cost an estimated \$350,000, according to an application which has been filed with the state engineer by J. Edwin Johnson of Vale, asking for the appropriation of 100 second feet of water from the Middle Fork of the Malheur river. E. E. Cotant of Stanfield, Umatilla county, has filed an application covering the appropriation of water from a drainage ditch of the Umatilla drainage district for the irrigation of a small tract in the Stanfield vicinity. George T. Elser of Merlin, Or., has filed an application covering the appropriation of water from Laundry creek for the irrigation of a 10 acre tract near Merlin and for domestic purposes.

## Six Alleged Offenders Indicted by Grand Jury

Indictments were returned against six persons yesterday afternoon by the Marion county grand jury after making speedy investigation of the several cases bound over to the grand jury for investigation.

Indicted on a charge of contributing to the delinquency of a minor, Alice Smith, Joseph Lichty and Romeo Lais are held under bonds of \$1000 each. Alice Smith was not arraigned, but attended court yesterday afternoon. Lais and Lichty pleaded guilty to the charge when arraigned before Judge Kelly yesterday. Sentence was not pronounced yesterday afternoon.

John A. Hess and Nora Dennis were indicted on the charge of lewd and unlawful cohabitation. They pleaded guilty to the charge and are held under \$500 bonds. Hess was also arraigned on a charge of polygamy. The complaint was filed by his wife, Maud A. Hess, in the justice court last week.

Joseph Berdune, charged with uttering a forged check of \$35 on the First Bank of Donald August 20,

1919, was indicted. A bench warrant was issued for his arrest and he is held under \$500 bonds.

With the completion of these investigations, the grand jury working under the direction of Attorney General Brown will investigate the state treasurer's office, relative to the charges brought by a Portland paper concerning the purchase of municipal bonds. This investigation will begin Friday.
