### POLITICAL GOSSIP OF STATE AND LOCALITY

#### NEWPORT MAN FOR SECRETARY

Ben F. Jones Files His Candidacy for Secretary of State's Office

H. F. Jones of Newport, one of the Republican aspirants for secretary of state, filed his official declaration with the secretary of state Saturday. His slogan is "For better roads, more irrigated lands, deeper rivers and harbors, greater Oregon," and as a platform Mr.

Jones makes the following statement:

"I will, during my term of office, perform the duties of the office of secretary of state to the best of my ability. I stand squarely for more and better roads, more irrigated land, deeper rivers and harbors, a bigger and greater Oregon and 100 per cent Americanism."

The Republican party has a woman candidate for presidential elector. She is Harriet C. Hendee, 566 Lexington street, Portland.

Other candidates who filed Saturday were:

A. M. Wright, Moro, Republican, for representative from the 25th district.

Glen R. Metaker, St. Helena, Republican, for representative in the legislature from the 20th district.

William H. Gore, Medford, Republican, for representative in the legislature from the ninth district.

Robert H. Strong, Portland, Democrat, for delegate from the third congressional district to the Democratic national convention.

E. V. Carter, Ashland, Republican, for representative in the legislature from the eighth district.

Steelhammer Will File.

His intention of becoming a candidate in the state primary election for the nomination of county assessor has been formally announced by Oscar Steelhammer, secretary of the Salem Business Men's league. Mr. Steelhammer said that he would file his declaration of candidacy and circulate his petitions within the next week or ten days. He will enter his name on the Republican ballot.

Mr. Steelhammer has been secretary of the Business Men's league for almost a year. Previous to that he served about six years with the county in the capacity of chief deputy assessor. This is the first time Mr. Steelhammer has been a candidate.
