Ontario Democrat Wants to Go to Convention

Leslie Jefferson Aker of Ontario yesterday filed with the secretary of state his candidacy for delegate to the national Democratic convention at San Francisco. His slogan is "Bryan for president; endorsement of wonderful accomplishments of Wilson administration."

Other candidates who filed yesterday were: Earl E. Fisher, Republican of Beaverton, for representative in the legislature from the 15th representative district.

D. R. Parker, Republican of Condon, for circuit judge of the 11th judicial district.

Dr. W. D. Wood of Hillsboro filed with the secretary of state his candidacy as a candidate for secretary of state.

RIVER LEASES TO YIELD CORN

State Land Board Soon to Open Bids on Beds of Willamette

The state land board estimates that \$20,000 a year will be received for the irrevocable school fund royalties on sand and gravel taken from the Willamette river between Oswego bridge in Clackamas county and the Hawthorne street bridge in Portland. Bids on lease of the bed of the river between those points have been received from five Portland companies and will be opened April 20.

Under the terms of a new law that became effective in January the state land board is authorized to lease the beds of navigable streams to companies who will pay the state a royalty on the sand and gravel extracted. The board has fixed the royalty at a minimum of 10 cents a cubic yard. George G. Grown, clerk of the board, says that many companies

that are in the sand and gravel business in the state are extracting gravel and sand from the beds of navigable streams without lease from the state and are thereby violating the law. Leases up to this time have been made only on beds of the Umpqua river and the Willamette at the mouth of the Yamhill river.

The Portland firms that have submitted bids on the bed of the Willamette from the Oswego bridge to the Hawthorne bridge are the Columbia Digger company, the Star Sand company, the Columbia Contracting company, the Diamond O Navigation company and the Nikam & Kelly Sand & Gravel company.

EUREKA MILLS IN OPERATION

Full Capacity Has Not Been Reached in New Plant of Bishop Brothers

The following article copied from the March 1 issue of the Humboldt Standard, the evening newspaper published at Eureka, Humboldt county, Calif., will be of interest to many readers of The Statesman. The article was accompanied by a picture of the mills.

The machinery of the former Humboldt Bay Woolen mills, now known as the Eureka Woolen mills, was started up again about two weeks ago and soon it is expected to have the mills working full force. At present about 30 hands are employed in the manufacture of blankets and flannels, but as soon as the remaining and some additional machinery can be made ready the force will be increased to about 50 and the making of suiting cloth will be begun. The Eureka mills are now part of the Bishop brothers' plants in Oregon, their purchase having been made necessary by the rush of orders at the Oregon mills. The local mills have been incorporated separately with C. M. Bishop, formerly of Salem, Oregon, president of the company, F. E. McGee vice president and local manager in charge of the mills here, and C. P. Slade, secretary-treasurer.

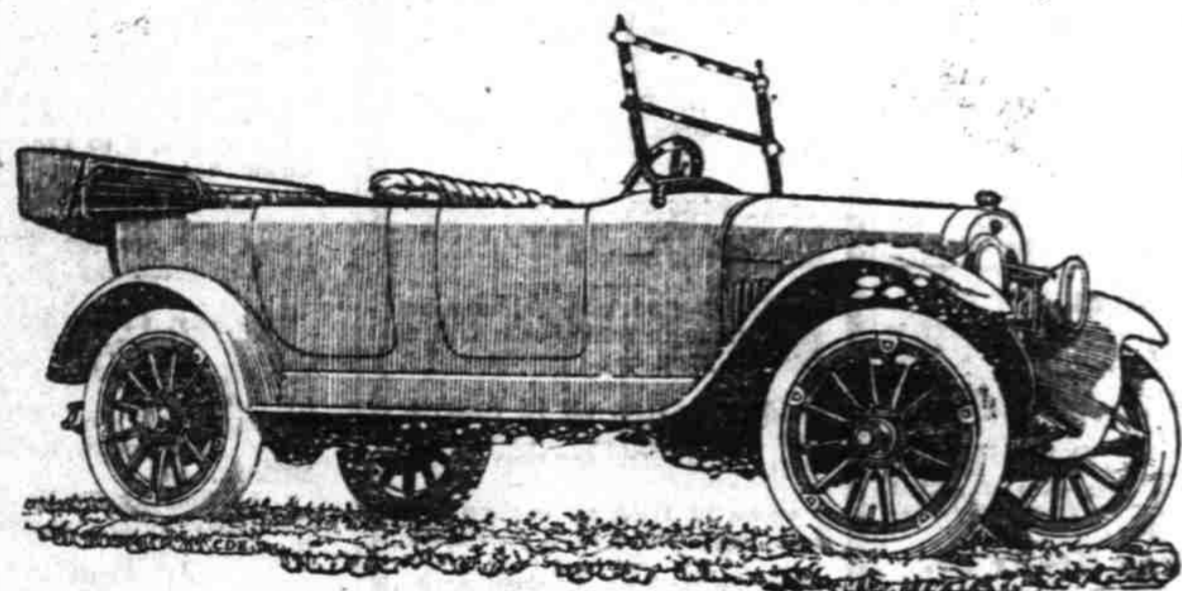
