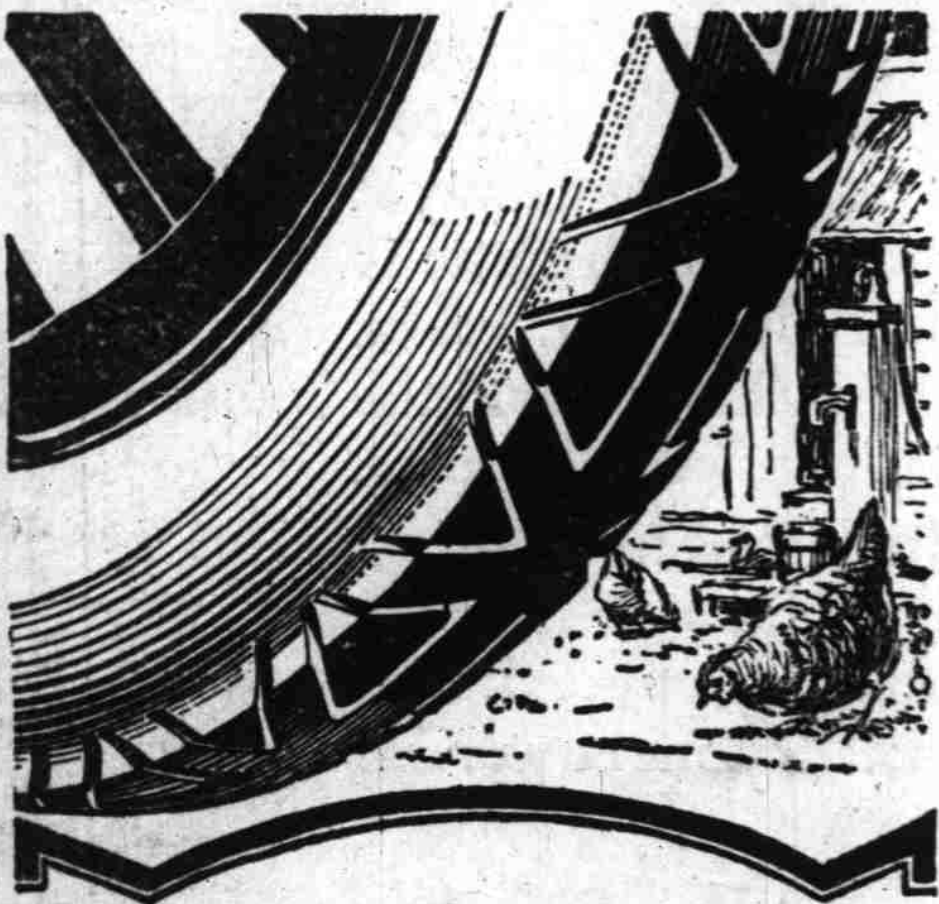
**Jason Lee Memorial.**
