**Can't Collect Tax**—  
The municipality of Newport cannot exact from Lincoln county road taxes levied on the assessment of 1919 though the city voted itself a separate road district removed from the power and authority of the county, declares an opinion of Attorney General Brown, written for C. D. McCluskey, district attorney for Lincoln county.

**Albany Car Stolen**—  
The police were notified by the Albany police yesterday of the theft of an automobile bearing Oregon license No. 34899, from the streets of Albany some time Monday night.

**Tooze Is Orator**—  
Walter L. Tooze Sr., has been chosen as orator by the Eugene Elks for their annual flag day exercises, which will be held June 13. It has not been decided whether the exercises will be held in the armory or the Elks hall.

**Candidates Line Up**—  
Filing for office without a "war-cry" seems to be quite popular, and three more men have added their names to those already filed. They are Edward Schuncke and H. H. Vandervort for alderman in the first ward, and George I. Wenderoth in the fifth ward, who is running for a four-year term. The prospective councilmen filed their declarations of candidacy with City Recorder Earl Race Tuesday.

**Jefferson Is Candidate**—  
J. J. Jefferson, whose home is in the fifth ward, yesterday signified his intention of filing his declaration of candidacy for alderman from that ward. As yet he has not announced a platform but very likely will as soon as his petitions are in circulation.

**Sues for Divorce**—  
Another proof that Vancouver marriages are not the kind that last was filed in the circuit court yesterday when William G. Buchanan instituted divorce proceedings against Mary Buchanan. The Buchanans were married February 17, 1919, and a few months later the wife is alleged to have left home. For over a year she has refused to return to her home, it is asserted, and on those grounds Mr. Buchanan asks for a divorce.

**Firms Receive Contracts to Take Sand and Gravel**

Contracts were let by the state land board yesterday to five concerns giving them the right to take sand and gravel from the Willamette river between the Oswego bridge and the Hawthorne bridge in Portland. Each firm to pay the state a royalty of 10 cents a cubic yard with a minimum payment of 10,000 yards a year each. This assures the state a royalty of at least \$5000 a year on the five contracts. The firms that were awarded contracts are the Diamond O Navigation company, the Nickum & Kelly Sand & Gravel company, the Columbia Digger company, the Columbia Contract company and the Star Sand company.
